### Biggest design weakness and where I get my fix...

"My biggest weakness is actually Pinterest. It's a well of inspiration that I go back to constantly, especially for product. It's a great tee up for shopping LCDQ. I like **Dessin Fournir** and **Harbinger** which have the best hardware, great textiles and ready-made product when you're grabbing for accessories; **Lucca Antiques** for handsome masculine product to counter balance my more feminine aesthetic; and it's always inspiring to go into **Kelly Wearstler**."
